Report on Service Activities

April 1969.

Last March saw the introduction of Service Secretary into the Club Committee and since then the Service section of the club has developed and become the most active aspect of the club's activities - (Just shows how active club isn't).

Previous to the introduction of Service Secretary, service flourished, but was completely separate from the club; and took the form of a Mixed Service Crew headed and organised by a triumvirate. This Service Crew initiated the present theme, ideas and contacts for the Service Secretaries of the future.

The basic aim of this service is to organise one or two activities a term for Liverpool Scouts and Guides aged between 14 and 17 (and they really do need some help from somewhere). The first venture was a Mixed Activities Day - 'Venture 68' - held in March 68 and since this there has been a Joint Weekend Camp in June 68, a day's walking in the Peak District in November 68, and a repeat of the first activities day on 1st March 1969. Also several members of the club have spent a week end as a Working Party at Liverpool County Guide Camp Site in March.

Expected service activities for next term include a joint midnight hike early in May and a joint weekend camp in June.

A little service has now become an established part of the club's function and it is hoped that it will continue and flourish for many years to come, and that future Service Secretaries will not be afraid to experiment and try out any new ideas.
