4: Banned Activities

1. Overview:

- 1.1. This factsheet details the activities that are banned within SSAGO. For more information about activities please refer to the 'Activity Guidelines & Nights Away' Policy Document.

2. Banned Activities:

- 2.1. The following are activities that SSAGO members are **not** allowed to participate in on club or national SSAGO events.
 - Knife throwing
 - Towing or riding of inflatables behind powered watercraft (eg banana boating)
 - Cutting glow sticks
 - Bungee jumping
 - Go karting/quad biking on public roads - these are permitted indoors or on private tracks.
 - Hitch-hiking
 - Horse vaulting
 - Releasing sky-lanterns and helium balloons
 - War Games where weapons of any form are used against human- or animal-shaped targets, including laser tag, combat style archery activities (e.g. archery tag), virtual reality war games and paintball. This doesn't include:
 - o Use of such weapons against other targets (e.g. using a paintball gun as part of a coconut shy or laser clay pigeon shooting).
 - o War Games like Capture the Flag, Ninja, Tag, Assassin where no weapons are used (e.g. using hands to tag).
 - o Official sports where weapons may be used (e.g. fencing, martial arts).
- 2.2. These activities are not acceptable under any circumstances.
- 2.3. Clubs must note that the use of a 'mystery evening' to undertake one of these activities will not be tolerated by SSAGO, Girlguiding UK nor The Scout Association, and sanctions will be sought against clubs who do this.
- 2.4. These activities are **NOT** underwritten, under any circumstances, by SSAGO's insurers.
